Word from our Head Coaches:

Dan introduces our Head Coaches.

Étienne Genesse-Grenier: Head Senior Coach (Train to Train & Train to Compete)

Étienne expresses that he is very happy to be back with the Bluefins. He coached the 3A Group at the Bluefins 5 years ago and started his swimming career with the Bluefins. He swam 3 years at the Bluefins then went to Pointe-Claire and in university swam with Vert & Or at Sherbrooke University. His swimming career gave him the opportunity to do a lot of travel. Étienne has a Phys Ed Degree from Sherbrooke University. His full bio id on the website. He adheres to the theory that who you are as a swimmer is heavily influenced by who you are outside of the pool. He believes that good coaching requires a good understanding of not only the athletes, but of the individuals behind the goggles and those who surround them. His objective is to help every single swimmer in achieving their own unique goals both in and out of the pool.

Marina McDonald: Head Coach (Learn to Train)

Marina introduces herself as the Head Coach of the Bluefins as registered with Swimming Canada and Natation Québec. She has been coaching with the Bluefins since 2016 and was a competitive swimmer for 13 years. Marina holds a university degree in Phys Ed and currently works as a Phys Ed teacher for the Lester B Pearson School Board. Marina coaches' groups in the Learn to Train stream which include Regional, Regional Development, Provincial Development and Age Groups 2&# as well as in charge of the Swim School. She also does administrative work for the club and is the one who does all the entries for swim meets. Marina was also very involved in staffing the Swim School coaches.

Financials:

- Due to Covid it was a challenge to budget last year but we did well considering
- •Swim school brought in more revenue than budgeted
- •The home swim meet was a success and raised a great sum of money for the club total
- Expenses were low due to the shut down saving on salaries/pool rental and no big expenses related to away meets.
- •These combined left us with a 37k reserve for the next season towards equipment, coach mentoring and training.

Registrar's Message:

Dan introduces Amy.

Thank you Dan.

Good evening Bluefins / Bonsoir,

Je m'appelle Amy Bates, ma fille nage avec le groupe Senior et je suis la registraire depuis 2020. Je vais livrer mon rapport en anglais ce soir.

As we ramped up to get this new season underway, it has been a pleasure working with my fellow Board members, the coaching staff, and of course, you, the members.

To quickly recap the 2021-22 season,

- As I presented at last year's AGM, we started with 263 swimmers across Masters, Competitive, and Swim School which was a 27% increase over the pre-COVID registrations.
- By the end of the season, a few competitive swimmers had withdrawn but Masters and Swim school grew.
- In July and August, we registered 25 swimmers from our younger competitive, Redfins and Yellowfins groups in a 7-week Mini Training Camp to enhance their technique and keep working on their skills over the summer.

After the season came to a close at our BBQ and awards night, registration and recruitment activities started for the new season with support from the Board and the coaching staff. In addition to promoting the club at ALPS summer swim meets, there were multiple tryout days at the Rec Centre in August and September. We welcomed more than 130 swimmers to the tryouts. I even met some alumni parents who were Bluefins themselves back in the day!

Registration numbers for the new season are:

- There are no concerns regarding registration numbers, we are on par with last season which was the highest number of registrations recorded.
- Competitive numbers are in line with 2 yrs ago and pre COVID levels.
- Interest in Swim School continues to remain high we had an 85% returning swimmer rate from Spring Swim School.
- Swim School registrations are up 66% from 2 yrs ago and up 80% from pre COVID level.
- Masters has grown in the past few years as well, after being flat it is up 36% from previous

3 years.

- Looking at some demographics
- o the average age of Swim School is 8 ½ years old, registrations spilt equally between boys and girls.
- o Average age of Competitve swimmers is 12 years old; we have 74 swimmers aged 12 and up and more girls than boys by about 25 swimmers.

I want to make special mention of those 13 swimmers who worked very hard and successfully advanced from the precompetitive Swim School into our competitive programs for this new season. Congratulations!

Thank you, parents, for your patience with my many emails over the past few months and for so quickly completing all the registration steps within our Streamline system and in Swimming Canada.

Although the season is now successfully underway and communications from me will be much less frequent, I am always available to you. Please feel free to contact me anytime.

One last thing I want to mention is that we will be searching for an Assistant Registrar to provide support to registration activities next spring/summer and shadow me to take over as Registrar since this will be my last year in the role. If this is something that may interest you as a volunteer, please let me know.
